



Along the length of the valley a line of tall willows grew and supported several large messy magpie nests. I constructed this "carousel" book to show just how complex the willows were and how persistent the magpies were.


### Barbara Mortkowitz

(LEFT) Ying Yang: Our Beautiful World, 2022-2023 Cyanotypes, film, collage, ocean items

This book started at Ocean Beach, making cyanotypes with the salty ocean and all kinds of organic things, including kelp. At the same time I was making cyanotypes from images I had made on film. I like to combine contrasting ideas, thus I superimposed and collaged 'man'-made architectural elements with more organic natural materials.

(LEFT) *Sheltering Me,* 2022 Dimensions: 5'1" long Text on handmade paper, thread, ceramic house, fired clay, glazed

In a paper making class, I decided to make an Ethiopian Healing Scroll. It is said that these are medicinal scrolls, a healing ritual that alleviates spiritual symptoms. Since I like to work on several projects at the same time, I was also trying out my first ceramic piece. I made a little house that would protect my personal healing scroll as well.

# Cheryl Tall

(LEFT) *Letters From Sienna,* 2022 Dimensions: 9 x 6 x 1.5"

Altered book, markers, drawings, collage, antique papers, glue, paint, ink, wax pastels, hand knotted exterior handle with beads, wooden letters for title. My book, *Letters from Sienna*, is a medieval travel journal. I imagined a traveler from long ago, sending back home her hand drawn pictures of her adventures.

(BELOW, LEFT) Olympus, 2019 Dimensions: 10 x 8 x 2"

Altered 1920's book from The Netherlands. In Greek mythology, Mount Olympus was regarded as the abode of the gods and the site of the throne of Zeus. My book, *Olympus*, explores some of the mythology of the Greek gods, and gives them settings, friends and families. Collage, pens, markers, wax pastels, hand stitched binding, wood mat cover, carved wooden stand.

### Christa Way

(RIGHT) *The Repository*, 2019 Dimensions: 28" x 17"


The Repository is a compilation of 98 inner spiritual truths, each written on a handmade paper scroll residing in its own little niche. As well as a wall hanging, it is also interactive. By choosing a scroll at random and unfurling it, the piece can be used as a divination tool.

(BELOW, RIGHT) Captured Dimensions: 3 1/2" x 5"

Created in 2019, it was inspired by my friend Jen Crossley who originated this concept of using old cameras as the basis for books. This one traces the story of my parents 56 years of marriage, and pieces of the camera are used on the pages throughout the book.

Memories from the Past, 2021 Dimensions: 4.25" x 4"

The 'Memories' book is a fabric tribute to my grandmother. It was sewn from remnants of her vintage linens and handmade lace. It is embellished with embroidery stitches she taught me, as well as beads and buttons. Each page is sewn into the spine separately.

Paris, 2020 Dimensions: 5.5" x 3.75"

'Paris' is a mixed-media travel momento book made with an accordion style binding. The pages are actual square beer coasters that I covered in vintage paper. The pages are embellished with ephemera, trims, buttons, and beads that I obtained on a trip to Paris.

(ABOVE) Eye was Taught to be White, 2021 Dimensions: Pyramid box: 6" x 6.5" x 5.5" / Book: 4" x 4.5" x 7/8"

The murder of George Floyd, the growth of the Black Lives Matter Movement, and the pandemic combined to force me to look again at my white privilege. In this triangle book inside of a white pyramid structure, I tell three vignettes over the course of my life which demonstrate ways in which I was taught that the color of human skin created different realities for people. This book is one attempt to maintain awareness and increase my cultural humility to share rather than hoard the unearned white privilege I possess.

(LEFT) Weave this Way and That, 2021 Dimensions: 9.5" x 8.5" x 1-5/8"

Participating in Helen Hiebert's Weave Through Winter was the impetus for "Weave This Way and That". Local, covid-reduced travel-by-car trips provided opportunities to create the weavings. Ironically I originally learned the piano hinge structure when Helen taught an in-person class in San Diego many years ago.



### Lisa Robé Hartman

*Visionary,* 2023 Dimensions: 3-1/2" X 6-1/2", Arches Paper, Sumi Ink, Gold Leaf

2023 was a year of deep soul work. While listening to music and practicing with different tools to write words, "Visionary" kept surfacing and coursing through my hand. By cutting the word into small rectangular shapes, it took on a new life in a flag book structure.



### Maria Rebelo

An easy and economical book to make with a flexible spine that allows the binding to open without constraints. The cover was decorated with Sashiko embroidery.

(BELOW, LEFT) *Polka Dots*, 2020 Dimensions: H 6 1/4" W 4 3/4" Spine 1 2/8"

This is a structure developed by Gabriela Irigoyen inspired by a book developed by Philip Smith between 1970-1980. The covers are joined making an L shape at the center of the spine. This is an ideal structure for books with a spine bigger than 1.5cm.




(ABOVE, LEFT) Take Me to the Circus, 2022 Dimensions: 18 inches wide, 9 inches tall, 5 inches deep
